PROTECTIVE Community Residences

The Protective Community Residences, Wheeler's Road, Corner Brook consist of four enhanced assisted living residences operated by Western Health that offer a home-like secure environment for individuals with mild to moderate dementia.

In total there are four bungalow-style homes that can accommodate 10 individuals, each in a setting that is designed to enrich the lives of residents. Participation and involvement in daily activities enhances quality of life by encouraging residents to continue to live in community surroundings.

Supervision and support for residents is provided by personal care attendants 24 hours a day. Professional staff provide care coordination and leadership.

Persons will be considered for the Protective Community Residences if they:

- Have mild to moderate Alzheimer's disease or a related dementia.
- Require 24 hour supervision for safety or to prevent wandering.
- Are able to manage most aspects of personal care and daily living, but may require some help or reminding for successful completion.
- Are able to walk without assistance, but may use a walking aid.
- Are suitable for a group living environment.

How To Apply

Individuals with dementia or their loved ones who may be interested in living at the Protective Community Residences will need to meet with a Community Health Nurse or Social Worker to discuss options for care.

If enhanced assisted living seems like the best option for you or your loved one, you will be asked to help complete an assessment called a RAI Home Care Placement tool. Additional information will be gathered to determine the best care option for you and your loved one.
