Introduction

Burgeo is located on the south coast of Newfoundland and can be reached by Route 480 more commonly known as the "Caribou Trail". This road connects to the Trans-Canada Highway and takes approximately two hours to drive. Burgeo and area has a history of being believed to be discovered by the Portuguese. It has been a part of the fishing industry for the most of its existence till the moratorium in the early 1990's. Consequently, the communities have survived the economic consequences with promotion of the tourism in the area. The town of Burgeo is a small town that services smaller outlying areas such as Ramea, Francois, and Grey River that are only accessible by boat or helicopter.

Community assets include anything that can be used to improve the quality of community life. This may include things such as a physical structure or place, community service or health service. The purpose of the Primary Health Care (PHC) community assets report is to provide insight into the resources that communities have available to them to support health and wellness. Community assets can be used as a foundation for community improvement. Understanding a community's strengths makes it easier to understand what kinds of programs or initiatives might be possible to address the community's needs. The purpose of this community asset listing is to identify the assets available in the Burgeo and Ramea Primary Health Care Area. It is recognized that while this listing may not include every community asset, it should provide an overview of the major assets available within a health region, with a focus on health and community resources that support individuals and communities in maintaining a safe and healthy environment. Please find below the community assets summary of the Burgeo and Ramea (PHC area).

Community Assets Listing

Health Related Assets

The Calder Health Care Centre is located in Burgeo and provides many of the essential health care services for the area. The health centre provides Emergency, Acute, Long Term Care, Medical Services, Radiology (x-ray only), Laboratory, Outpatient and Population health services such as Community Health, Mental Health and Addictions, and Community Supports. There is a clinic in Ramea that has a full time Licensed Practical Nurse on site and visiting Nurse Practitioner (when available) that provides monthly visits to the clinics located in Francois and Grey River. Ramea clinic provides blood collection and pharmacy services. It is important to note that it is situated 213 km from the Western Memorial Regional Hospital in Corner Brook, which is the major acute health care site for Western Health.

There are several services which provide travelling clinics to Burgeo. These include a private practice Dental clinic once monthly when possible, Physiotherapy (quarterly), Occupational Therapy (quarterly). Various telehealth services are provided to the area, majority of which are provided at the Calder Health Care Centre (mainly due to limited broadband width to other clinics). There are no support groups in the area, with the exception of a regional Alzheimer's support group that is offered through telehealth at the heath centre.

There is one seniors' cottage located in Burgeo to support seniors in an independent living arrangement throughout the Burgeo area, as well as, the eighteen long term care beds at Calder Health Centre. There are no personal care homes, adult day programs, or meals on wheels programs in the area. Table 1 below provides a listing of health related assets by community for the Burgeo and Ramea area.

Early Learning and Childcare

Early learning and childcare is an essential part of healthy child development. In the Burgeo area, the Community Education Network (CEN) operates two family Resource Centres that provide fun and supportive environment for children from birth to age 6 and their parents /caregivers and Child Car Seat Safety clinics. Also, it is important to note that the preschools and nursery schools in the area provide early learning support to children up to kindergarten age. They are available in the Burgeo Academy Preschool and Preschool Early Start Program.

Community and Volunteer Organizations

Burgeo and surrounding communities have a vast geography and somewhat isolated due to limited access and transportation. Consequently, many of the programs and services provided to the area such as town councils, fire departments, recreation committees, social clubs, seniors clubs, youth groups etc. are solely supported by community volunteers. While there are no meals on wheels programs there are community volunteer groups that provide a similar type of service to seniors around the holidays. This is a very community specific initiative and heavily reliant on volunteers and fund raising. Conclusion

In addition to the town of Burgeo, the Burgeo Primary Health Care Area includes three rural communities of Ramea, Grey River and Francois. Calder Health Care Centre in Burgeo is the hub for majority of the health care services but there is a clinic in each community. Grey River and Francois are mainly for visiting health care members. The health care centre provides Primary Care Services, Ambulatory Care Services, Emergency Services, Physiotherapy and Occupational Therapy, Radiology, and Laboratory services. The facility also has three Acute Care beds and eighteen Long Term Care beds. Population Health services including Community Health, Community Support and Mental Health and Addictions are also available in the area. While individuals may need to travel to Western Memorial in Corner Brook for some services, some are able to be accessed via telehealth. Limited travelling clinics such as the dentist (private practitioner) which attempts to travel monthly to the area. There are volunteer fire departments throughout the area with one ambulance service located in Burgeo, with RCMP and Search and Rescue centrally located in Burgeo.

The Burgeo area includes four (kindergarten to Grade 12) schools, many different churches, Family Resource Centre satellite sites, and multiple community volunteer organizations and committees. Many of the programs and services provided to the area such as town councils, fire departments, recreation committees, seniors clubs, sports and recreation programs, youth and social groups etc. are supported by community volunteers.

The Burgeo Area is home to the Sandbanks Provincial Park, and much of the industry in the area supports tourism and is seasonal in nature (many restaurants, craft stores, museums, and heritage facilities, festivals, etc.). There are a variety of recreation spaces throughout the area and most communities have access to a playground, softball field, community or church hall, hiking/walking trails and campgrounds.

While the Burgeo Area may not have access to the variety of amenities seen in more urban areas (e.g. public transportation, big box stores, Malls/ retailers, etc.) there are many health and community services in the area. There is a large volunteer base in the Burgeo Area committed to supporting community based programs and initiatives in an effort to improve the overall health and well- being of their community.
